



As we approach our 50th year of improving the lives of animals in our community and beyond at the Danbury Animal Welfare Society, we express our profound gratitude to you, our <<Adopter or Donor>> for your invaluable contribution towards helping us fulfill our critical mission. Thank you!

Since 1974, DAWS has successfully rescued over 31,000 displaced animals from high-kill shelters and has helped countless more in our community. As we approach the final days of our shelter renovation project, our commitment to remaining a leading animal welfare provider has never wavered. Thanks to our entire team, a growing foster network, Wags, Pleasant Paws, Mount Pleasant, and people like you, our work has continued with great success!

We have provided care for more than 2,000 animals in the past year. Our work included rescuing and rehoming 800 cats and dogs, providing 663 low-cost clinic services, increasing community outreach efforts, and continuing our TNR program to reduce animal overpopulation. Additionally, we completed 72 transports with our rescue partners, saving animals from being euthanized.

DAWS continues to receive daily requests from the community to accept surrendered pets and local strays. This year, we've taken in 156 animals and placed them in safe, loving homes. This season, we share two of the many inspiring stories that exemplify how YOUR generosity brings hope and renewal to animals and humans alike.

Zelda, a friendly rat-terrier mix, was brought to DAWS in January through our rescue partner in Kentucky, STAR (Saving the Animals of Rowan County). She was a stray, and it was estimated that Zelda was six years old. Upon her arrival, Zelda was placed in a foster home with Megan and James Warren of Danbury, along with their dog Rex.

Upon examination by Dr. Cary Brenner, our resident veterinarian, we learned that Zelda had Lyme Disease, partial facial paralysis, and a subcutaneous mast cell tumor in her leg - cancer. After consulting with specialists, including an oncologist, it was agreed that leg amputation was the only option to save Zelda's life. Although difficult, our brave clinic team performed the surgery and on March 9th, Zelda became a tripod. Dr. Brenner even took her home for overnight observation.

During this traumatic time, the Warren family found a true champion in Zelda. Megan shares, "Zelda is resilient, has recovered quickly, and continues to be a happy and playful dog. DAWS explained everything to us and allowed us to be part of the process." After surgery, they gently placed Zelda in her bed, but she then got up and hopped over to the water bowl! Soon after, her walking significantly improved, and she even began tackling the stairs.

The Warrens officially adopted Zelda in May! Megan adds, "We never planned to adopt an older dog with special needs, but Zelda stole our hearts. She's a resilient pup who can brighten anyone's day. We believe that Zelda knew she had found her forever home before we did and it's hard to imagine life without her. It's as if her leg is just invisible instead of missing."

She shares a natural bond with brother Rex, from our Toy Story litter in 2021. The best news is that Zelda has been declared cancer-free! We do not deny care to our animals due to the financial burden. Medical care costs for Zelda exceeded \$1,500.

One chilly autumn evening, as the nights grew colder, Bob, a kind-hearted resident of Danbury, noticed a litter of kittens near his front porch. He recognized the mother cat from a group that would occasionally visit the neighborhood. Fearing for their safety, especially the kittens, Bob brought them inside his home. A few months later, he heard meows coming from under his bed and soon discovered that his household had grown to 17 felines! Many people are unaware that kittens can become pregnant as young as four months old.

Feeling overwhelmed, Bob turned to a local veterinarian for help. The veterinarian suggested that he reach out to DAWS, knowing we provide aid to the community. We were happy to step in and immediately place the kittens in our foster program. Our team provided them with

step in and immediately place the kittens in our foster program. Our team provided them with medical care and all the necessary support. Some of the kittens, such as Thumper and Flower, required bottle feeding, which our team is trained to administer.

As time went on, more feral colonies were attracted to the same location, and DAWS intervened with trap, neuter, and release services to help reduce animal overpopulation. To date, we have cared for over 33 cats in this area, 24 of which have been adopted into loving homes. The expenses incurred in this ongoing community outreach effort have exceeded \$5,000.

"All I wanted to do was save them, and then DAWS saved me. I trusted they knew exactly what they were doing after meeting me. I love hearing the adoption stories and knowing the cats went to loving homes. I hope this inspires people to give and reach out when they are in need.
