#### Greetings from DAWS!

As we close out our 50th year of improving the lives of animals in our community and beyond, we at Danbury Animal Welfare Society express our heartfelt appreciation to you, our supporter. Your invaluable contributions have allowed us to fulfill our mission. Thank you!

Over 50 years, DAWS has helped over 40,000 animals, including rescuing over 32,000 at risk animals from high-kill shelters. This year we completed our renovation and moved back to our home, which has strengthened our ability to assist more animals than ever before. We will remain a leading animal welfare provider thanks to our entire team, our supportive foster network, WAGS Doggie Daycamp, Pleasant Paws Pet Center, Mount Pleasant Hospital for Animals, and people like you, our allies.

Over the last year, we have provided care for more than 2,200 animals. DAWS rescued and rehomed over 950 cats and dogs, sheltered over 1000 animals, and helped over 500 animals with low-cost clinic services.

DAWS' impact on the community has strengthened with 388 local animal intakes, the continuation of our TNR program, and our partnerships with local organizations including the Danbury Animal Control. This season, we share two of the many inspiring stories that exemplify how YOUR generosity brings hope and renewal to animals and humans alike.



# A Story of Two Lives Saved

Sprinkle and Twinkle, two Australian Shepherd puppies were brought to DAWS in September through our rescue partner in Kentucky, STAR (Saving the Animals of Rowan County). Sprinkle and Twinkle were a special litter, more at risk than other puppies as they were both believed to be blind. It would take a special foster to care for them. We are lucky enough to have such a dedicated foster, Debbie.

Upon observation, our resident veterinarian, Dr. Brenner, was curious about the eyesight of Sprinkle. Sprinkle's eyes responded to light and he seemed to follow with his eyes, but he did not seem to be responding to sound. His examination determined he was actually deaf. At Twinkle's examination Dr. Brenner discovered he had corneal scarring and cataracts, alopecia, and was underweight. Twinkle was indeed blind and would require extra TLC and many visits to the DAWS clinic to ensure his health continued to improve.

Despite their impairments, Sprinkle and Twinkle quickly adapted to their foster home, thriving independently, perfect just the way they were.

Both puppies, despite their challenges, have found homes and continue to thrive with the support of DAWS. Sprinkle was the first to be adopted by a loving family. He continues to flourish and has adjusted very well to his surroundings! Twinkle required additional care before being available for adoption which our clinic team was able to provide.

After being cleared by Dr. Brenner, Twinkle found his loving home with a family, willing to go above and beyond to give him the best possible life!

## A Story of Second Chances

One summer four years ago, a DAWS TNR volunteer, Lauren, was out taking care of a feral colony. She noticed a female cat, soon to be named Torvi, with a big belly, and knew that babies were on their way. Lauren knew she had to trap her. Luckily, Torvi was trapped on July 15, 2020, and gave birth to 6 healthy kittens in Lauren's care. DAWS found loving homes for all of Torvi's kittens.

Torvi had lived in her colony for so long that she preferred to return, showing little interest in human interaction and becoming increasingly distrustful. The decision was made for Torvi to be vaccinated, spayed, and rejoin her colony, where she was happiest.

On March 6, 2022, Lauren visited the colony and found that Torvi had something seriously wrong with her. Lauren immediately took her to DAWS where Dr. Brenner found that Torvi had a broken jaw. He knew the best thing for her was to operate and wire her jaw to repair it.

Following the surgery, Torvi required 3 months of in-home care, which Lauren was happy to provide. During this time, Torvi learned trust and enjoy human affection. Once healed, Torvi was adopted, but unfortunately her adopter passed away. Torvi's return brought more challenges as she needed time to reacclimate due to the drastic changes in her life. Torvi then developed eye issues, soon to be diagnosed as Keratoconjunctivitis Sicca, dry eye syndrome, which caused irritation to her eyes and meant lifelong treatment for her.

Torvi patiently waited in Lauren's home until January 2024 when her savior, Christina, came to meet her. Christina fell in love with Torvi and was so excited to bring her home forever! Your gift helps to provide lifesaving care.
